### Call for Applications to Lisbon's Doctoral Program in Social Psychology (LiSP)

The Scientific Commission of the Inter-Institutional Social Psychology Doctoral Program, entitled Lisbon PhD in Social Psychology (LiSP), is hereby opening a call for applications to this Doctoral Program in Social Psychology (12 positions) for the 2019/2020 academic year.

LiSP is a joint Doctoral Program, financed by FCT, that is jointly conducted by three Doctoral Programs in Psychology in Lisbon: The PhD Program at ISCTE-IUL (through the Centre for Social Research and Intervention – CIS-IUL – and the Department of Social and Organizational Psychology – DPSO); the PhD Program at the University of Lisbon (through the Institute for Social Sciences – ICS – and the Faculty of Psychology); and the PhD Program at ISPA—University Institute. All information about the doctoral program can be found at [www.lisp.pt](http://www.lisp.pt).

In order to complete the application to the LiSP Doctoral Program in Social Psychology, students must apply to a doctoral program in Psychology at one of the three participating institutions (ISCTE-IUL, FP/ICS-UL, or ISPA). Detailed information about the application criteria and procedures can be found in the Regulatory Standards for Doctorate Degrees, specific to each LiSP institution.

#### 1. RECIPIENTS

The Program is aimed at individuals interested in developing research in Social Psychology and intending to enroll in the first year of the Inter-Institutional Social Psychology Doctoral Program (LiSP). Most courses and seminars will be held in English, thus students should have mastered spoken and written English before entering the program.

#### 2. HOST INSTITUTION

The host institution must be one of the three institutions participating in the LiSP doctoral program, as established by the norms and regulations of LiSP.

#### 3. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

To fulfill the criteria for admission to the LiSP Doctoral Program, candidates should have:

- (1) A master's degree in Psychology, other behavioral or social science, or a degree that is recognized as equivalent to a master's program by the Scientific Commission of each participating institution.
- (2) A good final classification in the master's degree (or equivalent), usually a minimum final average of 14 points out of 20, or a CV that is rich in research-related activities, publications, participation in research projects, etc., that can add value to the applicant's merit when his/her degree's final classification is below 14.

- (3) At least sufficient undergraduate training to engage in post-graduate work in the chosen field.
- (4) At least the minimal English proficiency required of a contemporary international researcher.
- (5) A research proposal within the framework of Social Psychology, written according to the template attached to the current Call, which is also available at <http://lisp.ics.ulisboa.pt/applications.html>
- (6) An adequate supervisor and a research proposal suited to the supervisor's area of knowledge. An adequate supervisor meets the following criteria:
  - a. Possesses a doctorate in psychology or other discipline relevant to the project and is an expert in the project subject area;
  - b. Has published at least 3 articles (or 2 as first author in journals with an impact factor based ranking among the top 10% in the respective field) in international journals indexed in Thompson Reuters WoS (or 2 if the supervisor completed the doctorate in the past 4 years);
  - c. Meets at least one of the following three criteria: Has been a principal investigator in a funded research project, received a funded post-doc or Marie Curie grant, has successfully supervised at least 3 Masters theses; or have successfully supervised at least 1 PhD thesis.
- (7) A supervisory team that includes one supervisor that is affiliated to a foreign university that is validated as suitable by the Scientific Commission (e.g., those listed in attachment or others that can be approved ad-hoc by the Scientific Commission) and a supervisor who is a member of LiSP's Faculty (see the list in the annex). Candidates with a supervisor who is not a member of the LiSP Core Faculty must have a co-supervisor that is (in addition to the co-supervisor from a foreign university).
- (8) Candidates must have completed the required academic degree and have received official documentation (that is, the diploma) before submitting their application.
- (9) Holders of certificates issued by foreign education institutions must ensure that the documents submitted in the application: a) Mention the classification obtained to conclude the degree and the respective scale; b) Are complemented by a supporting document that lists the courses that were taken to complete the degree, respective classifications, and length of the program; c) Are complemented by a certified translation, whenever these documents are produced in a language other than Spanish, French, Italian or Portuguese. The application will not be considered if the submitted documents do not uphold these conditions.
- (10) Candidates admitted to the LiSP Doctoral Program should enroll in the LiSP's Doctoral Program at one of LiSP's host institutions and register in FCT within 30 days after publication of the results to this Call.
- (11) Candidates intending to enroll full-time should attest to their intention and availability to complete all required course work for the first year of the program by September, 2020.

#### 4. APPLICATION PROCESS

Formal applications to the LiSP Doctoral Program require an application to a Doctoral Program in Psychology at one of the three participating institutions (ISCTE-IUL, FP/ICS-UL, or ISPA). Moreover, the formal application for one of the **PhD Positions** referred to in this Call should be made by letter or email addressed to the Director of LiSP in which applicants a) submit documents that confirm that their application to a PhD Program was received, b) indicate their interest in applying for one of LiSP's PhD Positions, and c) declare that they "have taken knowledge of and accept the terms and conditions set out in LiSP's admission requirements" (see section 3 of this Call).

For a limited number of candidates scholarships are available. Candidates that are interested in applying for one of these LiSP's PhD Scholarships can find detailed information about this application in the "Call for Four Funded PhD Student Positions", available at: <http://lisp.ics.ulisboa.pt/applications.html>

## 5. ADDRESS FOR SUBMISSION OF APPLICATION LETTER

The letter or email required to formalize the application to the LiSP Doctoral Program, indicated in section 4 of this Call, should be sent to the email address [lisp.phd@gmail.com](mailto:lisp.phd@gmail.com) (with the subject/reference “Application to LiSP Doctoral Program”). Alternatively, the letters (with the subject/reference “Application to LiSP Doctoral Program”) can be sent in paper version to the address: Avenida das Forças Armadas, sala 2W08, 1649-026 Lisboa. Letters must be received within the specified application period.

## 6. APPLICATION PERIOD

Applications for the LiSP Doctoral Program will be accepted between the 10<sup>th</sup> of July and the 30<sup>th</sup> of September, 2019, but should nonetheless comply with the specific dates of the host institution.

## 7. SELECTION AND EVALUATION OF CANDIDATES

The selection and evaluation of candidates will be conducted by a jury consisting of the Scientific Commission of LiSP, chaired by a PhD in Social Psychology that is not affiliated with the participating institutions. This committee will assess the merit of the applications and produce a rank ordered list of candidates.

The selection of candidates will occur in three phases: 1) evaluation of the eligibility of candidates; 2) evaluation of the applications based on the submitted documents on a scale from 1 to 5; and 3) presentation of projects and discussion with the Scientific Commission of LiSP.

**Phase 1:** Exclusion of incomplete or inadequate applications. Applications that do not meet the admission criteria will be excluded (see section 3 of this Call).

**Phase 2:** Evaluation of the application.

- Merit of the candidate (40%), This assessment will be made by the Scientific Commission of LiSP taking into account the candidate’s previous training (degree, area, marks); the quality of the CV with respect to the research area (previous research experience, publications, scientific communications). The evaluation will be given on a 1 to 5 scale.
- Quality of the research project (40%). This evaluation is made by the Scientific Commission of LiSP based on the evaluation report produced by the internal leading reviewer, which considers the feedback from two independent reviewers. The assessment of the research project’s quality includes the scientific and innovative merits of the project for the advancement of the international state of the art, the feasibility of the work plan, and the fit of the project to LiSP Doctoral Program’s goals. The evaluation will be given on a 1 to 5 scale.
- Fit of the project to Social Psychology as a field of research (20%): According to the guidelines presented in Appendix (please see section 4 this Call). The evaluation will be given on a 1 to 5 scale.

**Phase 3:** Project presentation and discussion.

Based on the ranking of the candidates in Phase 2, candidates with a score equal to or above 2,5 will be invited for an interview in which they will present their project (15 minutes presentation) and discuss it with a panel of researchers (maximum 20 minutes) in person or via skype. A final ranking of the candidates will be available after this session.

Interviews will be evaluated according to the following criteria: a) demonstration of abilities to autonomously discuss the project, namely through a clear presentation of its ideas, demonstration of knowledge about the relation between these ideas and the relevant literature on the topic, demonstration of knowledge about the methodologies to be used, and the ability to discuss the main theoretical, methodological or applied contributions of the project; b) demonstration of critical thinking in the presentation of the project and in the discussion of the questions raised by the evaluation panel; c) demonstration of spoken English skills; d) merit of the project.

Members of the Scientific Commission of LiSP that have been identified as potential supervisors of applicants will not be involved in the evaluation of these candidates.

## 8. DISSEMINATION OF RESULTS

Applicants will be informed of the evaluation results by email and through the website <http://lisp.ics.ulisboa.pt/applications.html>. Candidates will have a 10 days period after the publication of the results to contest the results, pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Code. After this period, the final selection and ranking of candidates admitted to the PhD Program will be announced.

## 9. FINANCING

LiSP is financed by funds from the Portuguese Ministry of Education and Science and from the European Social Fund (as eligible) through the Operational Programmes of the 2014-2020 period, specifically the Human Capital Thematic Operational Programme, the Regional Operational Programme of northern, central, and midsouth Portugal, in accordance with the provisions of any applicable specific regulations.

### LISP Research Program: application guidelines

#### 1. Nature of the research Program

This section of the application form respects the research program of the proposed work.

1.1 This is a Social Psychology PhD Program. According to the European Association of Social Psychology, "Social psychology is a scientific discipline that is aimed at understanding how individuals' behavior, motivations, thoughts, and feelings are influenced by other people, real or imagined. What is special about social psychology as compared to other (social) sciences is its strong focus on the study of the underlying, psychological mechanisms that intervene in social phenomena. Based on scientific research, social psychologists have advised policymakers in numerous projects at national, regional and organizational levels, addressing a large array of problems in the domain, for example, of health, politics, work and organizational behaviors, law, education and the environment." (<http://www.easp.eu/about/social-psychology/>?).

1.2 Relevance for social psychology will be one of the criteria for evaluation of the applications. Research Programs that could easily be publishable in the European Journal of Social Psychology, in the Journal of Applied Social Psychology or in the Journal of Community and Applied Social Psychology, in terms of thematic fit even if not necessarily in terms of merit, will be better evaluated than those who would lack such a fit.

#### 2. Structure of the template

2.1 Title of the research program. The title should be concise and synthetic, comprehensible to a reader with general and scientific training and suitable for public disclosure.

- 2.2 Summary (maximum 150 words) the summary aims to be the abstract or summary of the research program of the candidate. A good summary should be so, supported by solid references and key observations, allowing to distinguish the proposed research program from the rest of the research developed in the relevant areas of Social Psychology.
- 2.3 Main Goals (maximum 300 words). What is meant to be known/achieved with the research programme.
- 2.4 State of the art (maximum 500 words) in this field, the candidate should indicate the State of the art and enhance the originality of the project. The State of the art corresponds to the current situation, the scientific perspective in Psychological Science, in general, and in Social Psychology, in particular.
- 2.5 Detailed description (maximum 1000 words) in this field, the candidate must present the research program developed in detail. The development and detailed description of the proposed work and research should provide the fundamental elements to allow your analysis and assessment in terms of both scientific merit and in Social Psychological relevance by the Panel.
- 2.6 Social Psychology Relevance (maximum 500 words). In this field, the candidate should present the proposed research question in terms of Social Psychology pertinent theoretical approaches and/or previous results.
- 2.7 References (maximum 20) use this field to indicate the references that underpin your research program.
